Presentation on CDBG Grant Approval by Mr. Larry Jones

Mr. Larry Jones spoke to the Board of Commissioners regarding a CDBG grant approved for the Town of Fremont and co-sponsored by Norwayne Alumni Association for \$900,000. Mr. Jones stated the town has not received any of the funds to date. He asked for help from the county's grant writer and said the Alumni Association is interested in developing an industrial park in or near the Town of Fremont.

Commissioner Antonio Williams asked County Manager Chip Crumpler to follow up on the grant. The County Manager asked Mr. Jones to provide his copies of the grant information so he could follow up on it.

Presentation on Bi-Weekly Payroll Transition by Finance Director Allison Speight

Finance Director Allison Speight gave an update on the bi-weekly payroll transition scheduled for March and April, attached hereto as Attachment A, and answered questions from the Board.

10:00 A.M. Opioid Workshop with Nidhi Sachdeva from NCACC

NCACC representative Nidhi Sachdeva gave a presentation on the Opioid Settlement, attached hereto as Attachment B, and answered questions from the Board.

Commissioner Joe C. Daughtery asked about the criteria for meeting with municipalities each year and whether it should be done as a group. Chairwoman Barbara Aycock asked if the meeting should only be with municipalities receiving funding. Ms. Sachdeva stated only counties received the funding but they could share the funds and the meeting should include all municipalities in the jurisdiction of the county. She suggested meeting as one group may be easier for the county.

Commissioner Antonio Williams asked about the criteria for giving funds to nonprofits. Ms. Sachdeva said one option was to portion out the funds for county programs and then decide on what local programs would receive the other funds. She stated RFPs (Requests for Proposals) could be required for those seeking funding. She cautioned the county to make certain all local programs fit within the legal requirements of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA).

Commissioner Joe C. Daughtery asked if the Health Department or Department of Social Services could use the funds and she said that was possible.

Mr. Carl Landgren from the audience asked questions related to services.

Ms. Audra Haddad asked questions about multi-county collaborations. Ms. Sachdeva said regional programs are happening across the state, specifically in the western area.

WHEREAS, WISH is committed to providing comprehensive health services to the students of Wayne County, improving the health of our youth, and addressing the disparities in health care; and

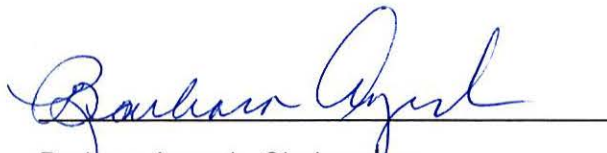
WHEREAS, WISH improves access to physical and mental health and nutrition services for more than 4,100 students; and

The applicant is requesting that the unzoned property be zoned Community Shopping (CS). The property currently is vacant and abuts US Hwy 70 Bypass E and Northgold Drive, just west of the Hare Road overpass. The CS district would allow for a variety of commercial uses.

All the adjoining property on the north side of the bypass is unzoned. However, the CS Zoning District is located less than 200' to the west and directly across the bypass to the south. The property to the north is used as a poultry farm, to the northwest is a single family residence, and the west is a Duke Energy substation. The Wayne County Growth Strategies Map identifies this property as being within an Urban Transition area.

The proposed zoning is consistent with the following Wayne County Comprehensive Plan policies:

Policy 2.1: NEW AND EXPANDING BUSINESSES AND INDUSTRIES should be especially encouraged that: 1) diversify the local economy, 2) train and employ a more highly skilled work force and 3) increase area resident's incomes.

Policy 2.9: Local economic development efforts shall protect, enhance and encourage a high QUALITY OF LIFE, IMAGE AND CULTURAL AMENITIES as critical factors in business retention, recruitment and economic growth.

Policy 3.1: Wayne County shall be an active participant in recruiting new business development with the objective of providing higher paying jobs to area citizens, expanding the tax base and recapturing a larger percentage of retail sales.

Policy 5.4: Wayne County supports the provision of CENTRALIZED SEWER SERVICES first within existing municipalities and communities and second within nearby targeted growth areas.

Wayne County also supports the provision of sewer services along designated highway corridors to encourage economic development.

Urban Transition Areas include those parts of the planning area that are not currently urban in character but that, during the next two decades, are likely to reach a level of development requiring urban services. These areas may have some services already in place including, particularly, centralized water and sewer. Other services, including stormwater management, are likely to be in place here within twenty years. Urban Transition Areas should be a secondary area for planning, programming and providing public urban services. Those parts of the Urban Transition Area that have good soils and drainage, are not in the floodplain, have road capacity available, and have sewer service nearby should generally be developed at 3 or more units per acre. Land areas constrained by poor soils and/or lack of topography and resulting flooding problems should generally be developed at lower densities.

Recommendation: Wayne County Planning Board recommends approval of the zoning request. NC General Statutes require that the Board consider the following items in making a decision on a rezoning:

- 1) Consistency with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan: Staff's opinion is that the request is consistent with Policies 2.1, 2.9 or 3.1 listed above considering that the proposed zoning is compatible with nearby commercial zoning and County has established commercial along the Hwy 70 Bypass corridor. Additionally, Policy 5.4 encourages economic development along highway corridors.
- 2) Consider if the request is reasonable and in the public interest: Staff's opinion is that the request is reasonable and in the public interest in that vacant property along the bypass has typically been commercially zoned so as not to promote residential development in close proximity to the major highway. Additionally, it is in the public interest in that there are other non-residential developments in the near vicinity.

**RESOLUTION #2023-4 : A RESOLUTION DELEGATING REFUND AUTHORITY FOR
OVERPAYMENTS OF EXCISE TAX TO THE COUNTY MANAGER PURSUANT TO
N.C.G.S. §105-288.37(a1)**

WHEREAS, all grantors of interests in real property are required to pay an excise tax to the register of deeds of the county in which the real estate is located before recording the instrument of conveyance unless otherwise exempted;

WHEREAS, on occasion excise taxes are overpaid due to such actions as recording a deed in the wrong county or mistakenly paying the tax when exempt;

WHEREAS, N.C.G.S. §105-228.37 authorizes local Boards of Commissioners to conduct a hearing to determine whether a refund should be granted;

WHEREAS, NC General Assembly Session Law 2022-50 amended N.C.G.S. §105-228.37 to authorize local Boards of Commissioners to delegate to either or both the county manager or county finance director the authority to grant requests from taxpayers for refunds on excise taxes due to overpayment; and

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Board of Commissioners recognizes that delegating this task is in the best interests of the citizens of Wayne County in that it will facilitate qualifying taxpayers receiving their just refund within a faster amount of time than the current system requiring official Board action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners:

1. That the County Manager is hereby authorized to grant requests for refund for overpayments of excise taxes paid in accordance with N.C.G.S. §105-228.37(a1).
2. That any taxpayer whose request for a refund is denied by the County Manager may file a written request with the Wayne County Board of Commissioners pursuant to the procedures set forth in N.C.G.S. §105-288.37(b).
